- Senior Center

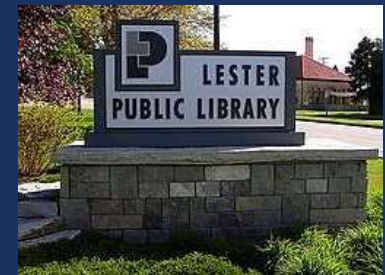

Registrations for Spring and Summer rec programs, leagues and events commencing after April 6 are still being taken, via mail, online, or by phone with credit card.

### Senior Center



Also effective at the close of business today and until further notice, the Senior Center will be closed to the public. This includes suspension of the on-site Senior Nutrition Program.

TRUST Car service is also suspended.

Tuesday's St. Patrick's Day dinner has been cancelled.

## CITY MANAGER'S REPORT MARCH 16, 2020

### City Hall

Effective on Tuesday, March 17 until further notice, public access to City Hall will be limited to the public areas of the first floor, and service functions will be limited to:

- Police Department business, at the Police Department service window
- In-person absentee voting, at the Customer Service counter.

Payments will NOT be accepted at the Customer Service counter.

Access to other areas of the building by appointment only.



## CITY MANAGER'S REPORT MARCH 16, 2020

### April 7 City Election and WI Presidential Primary

At this time, the election is still on and the City still plans to open all polling places. That said, residents are encouraged to go to [www.myvote.wi.gov](http://www.myvote.wi.gov) to apply on-line for an absentee ballot, which will be mailed to them.

If [myvote.wi](http://myvote.wi) does not already have your photo ID on file, you can scan in your drivers license or other ID and attach to your application.

Apply for an absentee ballot as soon as possible to make sure you receive your ballot and get it returned on time. Deadline to apply is April 2 (email or postmark date). Absentee ballot must be received on or before April 7.

## CITY MANAGER'S REPORT MARCH 16, 2020

### Police and Fire

Essential services remain per usual.

New operational protocols are being observed to limit potential virus exposure by personnel.

Departments are in process of developing protocols for quarantining personnel returning from out of state travel; isolating personnel in the event of confirmed exposure to the virus.

Public visits to facilities are not permitted. Public classes have been cancelled. Fire Dept. Fish Boil cancelled.

### Two Rivers Public Schools

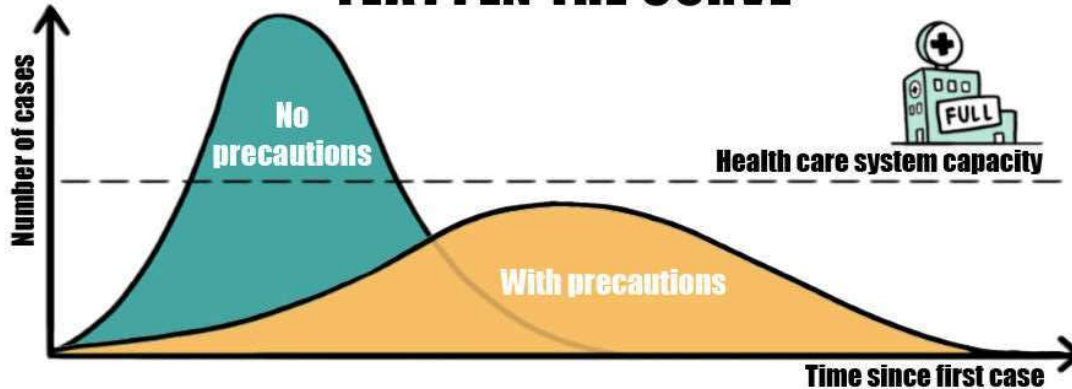
District Administrator Lisa Quistorf met with City Mgr., Police Chief and Fire Chief today, to discuss school closure as mandated by Gov. Evers' emergency order.

Two Rivers Schools are on Spring Break this week, but must stay closed until at least April 6, per the Governor's order.

Arrangements are being made for at-home and on-line schoolwork. Plans are also being made to provide meals for students, with curbside pickup at designated locations.

An on-line survey to all parents of TR Public School students was distributed today--requires a response by 9:00 AM on Tues., March 17.
