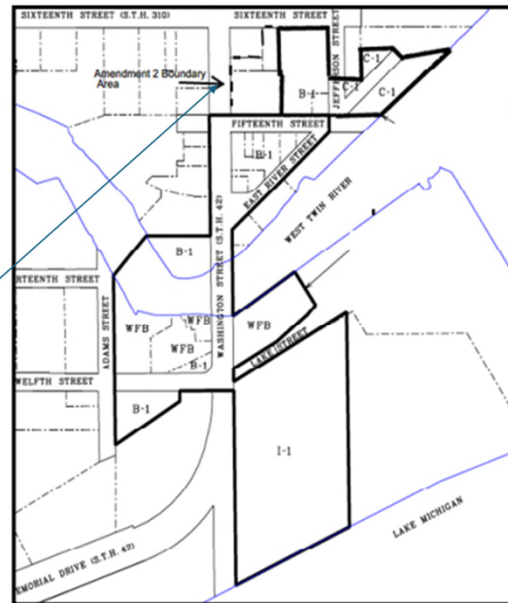

**11. Other—Reminder of Ordinance Provisions on Tall Grass**



**Ready, Set, Mow!**

As Two Rivers greens up for the Summer, the City reminds property owners that all lawns need to be kept cut to a height not to exceed 8 inches.

This requirement, stated in Section 9-3-4 of City Ordinances, applies to the yards of developed properties, and to vacant properties primarily vegetated with grasses.



**First Violation: Get It Mowed Promptly and There's No Fine or Bill.** The City must first mail a notice of violation to the property owner, giving 5 days from the date of mailing of that notice to comply. If the violation is corrected by the deadline, there's no fine or charge.

If the owner fails to cut the grass by the deadline, the City can "cause the lawn to be cut" (by City personnel and equipment or by a contractor) and will generate a bill to be charged against the property. In addition, the property owner will receive a \$75 fine if the mowing is not completed in a timely manner.

**Repeat Violations: Get a Fine, Maybe a Bill.**

If a property has "repeat violations" during the same calendar year, each additional violation carries a \$150 fine. That fine applies whether or not the owner mows the grass within 5 days of the City mailing a new notice.

Should the owner fail to mow the property timely, the City can also cause the lawn to be cut and will bill the owner for this service, in addition to the \$150 fine.
