 - Work on Madison Street is not expected to commence until utility work is finished on 25th Street – estimated to be early July







Security cameras are also being installed to deter vandalism









 - 1. City Funding Assistance from American Rescue Plan Act
 - --City's request was filed electronically, by Finance Director Dave Buss, on June 10; WI Dept. of Revenue confirmed receipt
 - --WI DOR is working to distribute funds by Friday, June 25
 - --City of Two Rivers' total allocation is \$1,155,645; half will be paid in 2021, half in 2022
 - --Funds can be used to make up for lost revenues due to COVID; extraordinary expenses due to COVID; or for investment in water, sewer or broadband infrastructure. Must be spent by end of 2024.
