





- 2. WEDC Idle Sites Grant Program Funding Application
  - --Application for \$250,000 to assist Trivers, LLC with planned improvements to the former Paragon Electric property, was submitted back in March
  - --As authorized at a special City Council meeting on April 14, City and Trivers LLC have each executed a proposed Development Agreement related to the City's role as a "pass-through" for this funding; that DA was forwarded to WEDC on April 15
  - --WEDC decision the application is expected by April month-end
