

City Council approved resolution for borrowing from the State Trust Fund Loan Program-\$950,000 at 5.75% interest for 20 years—on January 3, 2023.

City was advised on January 10 that the Trust Fund had just lowered the interest rate to 5.25%; we were given the option of withdrawing our application and requesting a new loan application packet, which would lock in the 5.25% rate upon the State's receipt of that request.

Request for a new loan application packet was filed via e-mail on January 10. The City will have 60 days from the date that packet is mailed to take formal action on the loan application.




