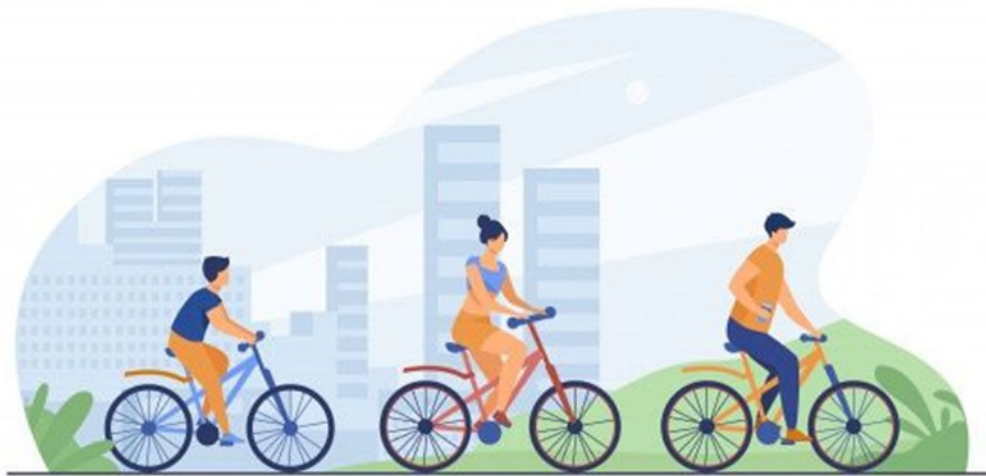




BICYCLE OPERATING RULES

- On streets always ride in the same direction as traffic.
- Ride at least three feet from the curb, parked vehicles, or debris in the curb area and ride in a straight line. Don't swerve in and out around parked vehicles.
- **Do not ride on the sidewalk.** It is illegal except for children in the learning stage and closely supervised by adults, or on bridges and few designated paths within the city. Operation on sidewalks can be more dangerous than on the road.
- Obey all traffic laws.
- Use bicycle and pedestrian trails where available.
- Keep to the right on trails, except to pass; announce your intent to pass walkers or other bicyclists before passing (“passing on your left”)
- Be predictable! Use hand signals to let other users know where you intend to go and maintain an understood course.
