GRANT TO FUND CONTINUED IMPROVEMENTS AT NESHOTAH PARK

The City's Parks & Recreation Department was recently awarded a grant from DNR's Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Program to assist with access and recreational improvements at Neshotah Park.


The \$209,500 grant award, which requires a 1:1 City match, will help fund a \$419,000 project to include:


- Removal of the tennis courts on 21st Street (to be replaced with native plantings/pollinator gardens)
- East-west pedestrian trail between concession stand and Garfield St.
- North-south pedestrian trail along Pierce St. from 21st St. to the beach
- Expanded parking along Piece Street

- Native plantings and stormwater swales along the Pierce St. corridor
- Two new small picnic shelters with tables & grills,
- Interior renovation of the restroom near the horseshoe pits
- Interpretative and wayfinding signage

The City plans to resurface Pierce Street from 21st to Zlatnik in conjunction with the park improvements.

These investments in the jewel of the City's park system are consistent with the Neshotah Park Master Plan developed by Parks and Rec Director, Mike Mathis, and the Advisory Recreation Board with considerable public input in 2023 and adopted by action of the City Council.





Need a ride?

T.R.U.S.T. Car

Any Two Rivers resident who is a member of the Two Rivers Senior Center (must be over 50 years old) and needs a ride, whether shopping, social, or medical, can make use of the center's TRUST car. TRUST car cards must be used, and can be purchased in the office or from the driver. Each card is sold for \$15 and has 10 punches, with each stop being one punch. Membership at the Senior Center costs \$15/year. Reservations for the car must be called to the Senior Center (920-793-5596) at least one day in advance. Rides to and from the Senior Center are free.
